### IA Case # 11-092 Conduct Unbecoming

On September 10, 2011, A private Citizen filed a complaint of "Conduct Unbecoming" against a Community Assisted Policing Effort (CAPE) Volunteer.

Complainant alleged that he was issued a citation by a CAPE Volunteer when he parked his vehicle in the handicapped parking area. He claimed his Handicapped Placard was displayed on his dashboard and was visible. When he confronted the CAPE Volunteer the Volunteer asked him if it was his vehicle and to prove if in fact he was handicapped. The complainant had to show his registration and his prosthetic leg to prove in fact he was handicapped. Complainant also claimed that he was being picked on by CAPE Volunteers because this is the second time he was questioned about his physical disabilities.

Internal Affairs obtained evidence that the complainants Handicapped Placard was displayed on his dashboard however the expiration date was covered and the placard has already expired.

The allege violation of "**Conduct Unbecoming**" against the allege CAPE Volunteer is **not sustained**.
